

## **Adapt Repository Take-down Policy**

The Adapt repository provides a service where a community of adaptation studies scholars can further develop their teaching and scholarship by sharing, adapting and commenting on each other's teaching materials. Sharing these resources benefits other teachers and learners.

If you believe that an item in the Adapt Repository:

- (a) contains or describes material that has been falsified or produced as a result of fraudulent or deceptive actions by any person;
- (b) infringes the legal rights of any third party;
- (c) contains defamatory, offensive, confidential or culturally sensitive material; or
- (d) the depositor is not the owner of copyright or does not have the permission of the owner/s of copyright in the Item to deposit it into the digital repository.

Please contact adapt.project@utas.edu.au with the following information:

- Identification of the item by title, description, and its URL;
- The nature of your complaint about the item, including any supporting evidence;
- You contact details including a telephone number and mailing address.

The item will be made inaccessible during a period of investigation and you will be notified if any further action is taken.

Items will be removed at the discretion of the Adapt Repository staff.

Any information provided by you will be managed in accordance with the information use policy of the Adapt Repository.
